

Concentration Camp Website

Overview	Students will use the Sauroopol program to create a website relating to the Holocaust and the different concentration camps around Europe at this time.
Objective	By using the web site creator, students will be able to make a site about a concentration camp that they picked with 100% accuracy.
Standards	WH.8 Students will analyze and explain trends and events of global significance, such as world wars and international controversies and challenges, and cross-cultural changes that have connected once-separate regions into an incipient global community. USH.5 Students will examine the causes and courses of World War II, the effects of the war on United States society and culture, and the consequences of the war on the United States involvement in world affairs.
Learning Environment	Students will be completing this project in a high school computer lab with the rest of their peers, and they will also be working on it for homework at home.
Materials	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Internet access• List of concentration camps• Computer
Procedure	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Log onto the internet2. Pick a Nazi concentration camp from World War II from http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List_of_Nazi-German_concentration_camps3. Research that concentration camp on the internet4. Log onto Sauroopol5. Create a web page about the concentration camp6. Include deaths, location, and any other interesting facts7. Include pictures and different styles of text on the site8. Include how this concentration camp altered the War9. Explain how the camp was eventually liberated, and by who10. Save the website11. Send the website to the teacher to grade
Evaluation	Students will be assessed on how creative their website is and how accurate the information about each concentration camp is. They will also be assessed on how much information they have about their concentration camp.
