

## Abstract Self Portraits

<b>Overview</b>	Students will be able to manipulate a picture of them into an abstract art.
<b>Objective</b>	Students will be able to use the online photo editing tool Splashup to make a picture of them into an abstract art form.
<b>Standards</b>	The lesson covers the Indiana State Standard for Fine Arts: Visual Arts <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 2.2- Students identify abstract works of art, works of selected artists, and common subjects and themes in art from various cultures.</li><li>• 2.2.2- Identify abstract works of art.</li></ul>
<b>Material</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A wallet sized photo of each student to upload to Splashup</li><li>• Computers with internet access for each student</li></ul>
<b>Procedure</b>	The Instructor will: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Provide students with a wallet sized photo of them.</li><li>2. The instructor will then show students some examples of abstract art made by famous artists.</li><li>3. Show the students how to use some of the basic features of Splashup to make their photos abstract.</li><li>4. Show the students how to access Splashup and help them as they work their way through making their photos abstract.</li></ol>

	5. Have the students print off their photo when they are finished manipulating it.
<b>Evaluation</b>	Students will be evaluated on their understanding of abstract art as well as their basic knowledge in using the photo editing tool Splashup.
