



History PowerPoint Project

By
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Objectives:	Students will understand the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• How to make a PowerPoint• How to edit pictures through Splashup• Understand their project topic• How to research their project topic
Materials:	The class needs the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A computer• Pictures they plan to use for their PowerPoint on a disc or flash drive• A Splashup account• Knowledge of their project topic
Procedure:	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Review previous lessons on the history of the 1960's and the 1970's. Ask students questions about the 1960's and 1970's in order to judge their skill level.2. Review each history topic assigned to each student for their projects. Again ask students questions about the topics.3. Go over PowerPoint project instructions and show an example PowerPoint project and show students how to make a PowerPoint and the tools to use on the overhead projector. Ask students if there are any questions about their projects.4. Explain to students that they must use Splashup to edit at least two photos that are to be included in their PowerPoint. Show how to use reach tool and how to edit a picture on Spashup on an overhead projector. Ask if there are any questions on how to use Splashup.5. Have students work on their computers and edit the pictures on Splashup that they brought with them. Go around and help the students. Tell the students to e-mail the finished pictures to you to grade them.
Evaluation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• If students take good use of class time, the students can receive five points.• If students use relevant pictures to their topics, the students can receive up to
