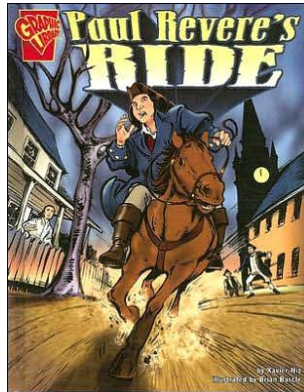


Paul Revere and other Riders of the Revolution¹

Grades: 9



Subject	US History
Overview	Paul Revere's ride is one of the most famous events in the American Revolution, but other Americans made rides similar to him.
Objective	Students will learn more about Paul Revere and other famous rides that were similar and different to Revere's.
Materials	Course Text Worksheets Papers Pencil Kontainer
Procedures	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Read the Ride of Tench Tilghman Poem. Ask students to volunteer to read certain parts of the poem, after discuss the story being told, the historical event of Tilghmans ride and the students opinions on Tilghmans ride and how it compared to Revere's.• Choose another Revolutionary Rider. Divide the class into groups and have them do research on riders: Jack Jouett, Sybil Ludington and Tench Tilghman. Afterwards have the students present what they found and if they should be remembered as well as Revere.• Paul Revere: Nation Folk Hero. After the students are done presenting, tell the students how Revere was

	<p>transformed from an American icon to a national Folk Hero.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Discuss why Revere's ride is best remembered. Discuss with the students on why they believe Revere's ride is best remembered of the four.● For extra credit, have students log onto Kontainer and download the extra credit file from there. Have the students do the extra credit worksheet and turn it in the following day.
Evaluation	<p>After the lesson students should know other important riders in American history and how they helped propel the Americans towards the Revolution.</p>
