




Title: Slavery

Subject: Social Studies

Grade Level: 5th Grade



<p>Overview</p>	<p>The students will be learning about how the conflict of slavery made such an impact on America.</p>
<p>Objective</p>	<p>Students will understand the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Controversies surrounding slavery • What became of these controversies
<p>Standards</p>	<p>1.1.3 Describe controversies pertaining to slavery, abolitionism, <i>Dred Scott v. Sanford</i> (1856) and social reform movements. (Government, Economics)</p>
<p>Materials</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kontainer (with account) • Students' books • Computer • Internet
<p>Procedure</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Have the students upload facts about what they know about slavery and the Civil War. 2) I will then look over the uploaded facts sheets, and upload an explanation of what each idea means and how it relates to slavery in America. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Ideas uploaded could include: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. Slave owners ii. Plantations iii. President Lincoln and his assassination

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> iv. Confederate flag b. Students will then download and review the list I have created. They will then upload questions they have based on any of the information. <p>3) This is to help students understand why slavery was such a huge controversy.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Why the South broke away from the rest of America b. What the Confederates were and what they stood for <p>4) I will upload separate pages with information about slavery that have not been discussed yet. For example, I would explain the Underground Railroad.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. How much of a risk it is for the people helping the slaves escape b. Different ways slaves escaped <p>5) Students are able to upload questions at anytime.</p>
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Evaluation: Pick one of the two projects to do.

Two Options	Project 1	Project 2
Instructions	Each student will make up a story about a slave trying to escape. What obstacles does he/she run into? Who helps them get to freedom?	Write a one page paper about the conflicts that caused the Civil War. Explain what the South did and what they wanted to achieve.
Points	Points come from the amount of creativity and information. The more in depth the story is, the more points will be awarded.	Points come from the accuracy of the information in the paper. The more information, the more points that are awarded.
Reason	To see if the student understands slavery during this time period.	To see if the student understands why the Civil War occurred.
