

## Journaling with Anne Frank

<b>Objective</b>	Students will be able to use Plurk as a journal to convey thoughts and provoke discussion on a classroom assignment.
<b>Types of Students</b>	High School students in and English Classroom.

<b>Materials</b>	-The Diary of Anne Frank -Access to computers
<b>Procedures</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) The teacher will present the book "Diary of Anne Frank".             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) The teacher will explain that Anne Frank was a Jewish girl during the Holocaust.</li> <li>b) They will also explain how the girl kept this Diary of her time spent in hiding from the Nazis.</li> </ol> </li> <li>2) Students will be reading this book over a 4-week period.</li> <li>3) The teacher will provide a rubric for when each chapter, or group of chapters, needs to be read by.</li> <li>4) The Teacher will also explain the assignment that will go along with the reading.             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Students will be keeping their own Journal/Diary using Plurk.</li> <li>b) The Students will sign up for a Plurk account, and give their user name to the teacher so that the teacher can follow their journal throughout the time students are reading the "Diary of Anne Frank."</li> <li>c) Students will have two choices during this assignment. They may:                 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i) Write a Journal with their daily activities.</li> <li>ii) Write a Journal as if they were in hiding to avoid being captured by those that mean them harm.</li> <li>iii)</li> </ol> </li> </ol> </li> </ol>
<b>Application</b>	-Students will write in their journal daily.  -Students will also be asked to respond once a week to a discussion question concerning the readings that were due for that week.
<b>Evaluation</b>	When the class has finished reading the book students will be given one week to transfer their journals into Word, correct grammar and spelling errors, and turn in a finished copy of their Journal.
