## How to Photoshop Heroes and Villains

### Background

<b>Procedures</b>	<p>A. Find which hero and villain you'd like to use for your project.</p> <p>B. Have them approved by the instructor.</p> <p>C. Students begin to edit the pictures. However, the final product must include the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Color scheme</li> <li>▪ The characters they chose</li> <li>▪ Have background that fits with the character's poses</li> <li>▪ Use 3 of the following filters:</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>➤ Brush Size</li><li>➤ Sharpness</li><li>➤ Brush type</li><li>➤ Dry brush</li><li>➤ Smudge stick</li></ul>
<b>Assessment</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>I. Students will turn in their projects and I will grade them.</li><li>II. They will hand me a rubric and a step-by-step process of what they did to create their image.</li></ol>
