



**THIS IS AN EXAMPLE OF A LESSON PLAN USING JUSTIN.TV THAT COULD BE USED TO TEACH A 10<sup>TH</sup> GRADE CLASS**

**ENGLISH: SHORT STORIES**

<b>Overview</b>	In this class the students will read 2 literary texts and note the differences in the genres
<b>Objective</b>	Students will : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify the difference between fairytales and Short stories</li> <li>• Identify new Vocabulary</li> </ul>
<b>Learning environment</b>	Classroom with a large screen and computer with a high speed internet connection

<b>Materials</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Large screen</li> <li>• Computer with high speed internet connection</li> <li>• Speakers</li> <li>• Microphone</li> <li>• Webcam or video recording device</li> <li>• Writing materials</li> <li>• Fairytale</li> <li>• Short story</li> </ul>
<b>Procedure</b>	Demonstrate their understanding of the definition of a short story through brainstorming, watching broadcast on justin.tv and the completion of a quiz.
<b>Application</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Read a fairytale together as a class</li> <li>• Read a short story together as a class</li> <li>• With justin.tv recording, hold a class discussion about the differences.</li> </ul>
<b>Evaluation</b>	In small groups, complete a short quiz about short stories, fairytales, and the characters of both the texts read and discussed (comprehension). The first group to complete all answers correctly wins. For homework, students can access the broadcast online, and discuss and comment with each other what they learned and ask any questions they may have during studying the broadcast.
